COMMISSIONING! CONGRATULATIONS CLASS OF 2017

Vice-President Mike Pance sends the Class of 2017 out to the Fleet

Vice President Mike Pence told the graduating class at the U.S. Naval Academy on Friday, May 26, the president will "always have your back."

The vice president says neither he nor Trump will rest until they "restore the arsenal of democracy, and he says "the era of budget cuts of the armed forces of the United States is over."

Pence, whose son is an officer in the Marines, spoke to 1,053 graduates, including 811 men and 242 women.

"Today you'll become leaders in the world's greatest force for good: the armed services of United States of America," Pence said. "All of you who do so are patriots, heroes who are the pride of your family and the pride of the American people."

Of the class of 2017, 768 will be commissioned as Navy ensigns and 259 will be commissioned as second lieutenants in the Marines.

NAVY **WOMEN'S LACROSSE**

After a historic run to the NCAA Tournament Semifinals, the Navy women's lacrosse team finished the year ranked sixth.

The Midshipmen won their fifth Patriot League Championship. In the NCAA Tournament, Navy upset No. 7 Penn, 11-10, for the first win in program history against a ranked opponent. The Midshipmen routed UMass, 23-11, in the second round to advance to the program's first ever appearance in the NCAA Quarterfinals to face defending National Champion North Carolina.

Against the No. 2 Tar Heels, the Mids rallied from being down 13-10 to score six of the final seven goals and post a 16-14 victory to secure a spot in the NCAA Tournament Final Four in Foxborough, Mass.

In the NCAA Semifinals, Boston College edged Navy, 16-15, to advance to the National Championship, ending the Mids' NCAA Tournament run.

Looking ahead at the Navy season - and what you need to know

The Navy Season Will Be A Success If ...

Navy wins ten games and it has to ... Beat Army. It might take a bowl win to get the job done, and there's too much turnover to win the conference, but getting to 9-3 before going to the post-season would be terrific.

With road games at Memphis, Temple, Notre Dame and Houston, it's going to take a few upsets and perfect performances to get there, but it's Navy. It reloads. And, of course, again ... beat Army.

Key Game To The Navy Season

Nov. 24 at Houston – Of course, the Army game is always going to be the key to the season, but in terms of wanting to have any hope of getting back to the American Athletic Championship, beating Houston could be a must to take the West. Going to Memphis will matter, and there are a slew of dangerous battles along the way, but lose to the Cougars, and forget about winning the division.

Navy Will Be Far Better If ...

The defense can get a third down stop. The 2015 defense struggled on third downs, too, but the team still held the ball for almost 33 minutes per game. Last year, though, the defensive problems getting off the field mattered more.

The Midshipmen were dead last in the nation in third down conversion percentage, allowing teams to convert 54% of their chances. For a team that has to own the time of possession and grind up the clock, it's a problem when the D gives up over 300 third downs and can't get off the field.
